IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION FORM



TO PARENT/GUARDIAN

Students under 18 years of age attending Ontario schools are required to provide proof of immunization against diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps and rubella as outlined in the Immunization of School Pupils Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.1.1. Exemptions may be granted for medical reasons or statement of conscience or religious belief, using the special forms available for this purpose from the Health Department. **FAILURE TO PROVIDE IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION COULD RESULT IN THE STUDENT'S SUSPENSION FROM SCHOOL. REMEMBER TO INFORM THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT OF YOUR CHILDS BOOSTER UPDATES.**

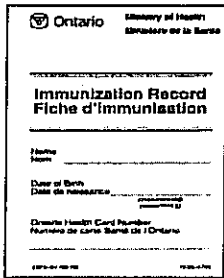


Parents...

Forward Immunization updates to the school office. The school will forward the immunization information to the Health Department for student record updating.

¹ Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) must be given after the first birthday, dose #2 a minimum of 28 days after dose #1.
² Meningococcal vaccine is available for 1 year old or 12 year old children (grade 7) or 15 to 19 year old youth.
³ Chickenpox vaccine is available for 1 year old children or 5 year old children who have not had chickenpox.
⁴ Hepatitis B vaccine is offered to students in grade 7 (based on a two dose schedule) at school immunization clinics.
⁵ Influenza (flu) vaccine is free to residents in Ontario ages 6 months and older and is available each year in fall and winter. Effectiveness of the vaccine is improved when 2 doses of the vaccine are given 1 month apart for children less than 9 years of age receiving their first influenza vaccine.
⁶ Tdap vaccine is recommended for people 7-64 years who are getting a 10 year booster and have not previously had a dose of acellular pertussis, are 7 years old and missed quadrivalent between 4-6 years or are starting or completing their primary series. Polio vaccine may be required in addition to the Tdap.
⁷ Pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine is recommended for anyone 65 years of age and older, as well as people 2 to 64 years of age who have certain high risk medical conditions. Conditions are listed at www.region.durham.on.ca
⁸ Human Papillomavirus vaccine is given to girls in grade 8 at a school clinic and is recommended for young women age 9-26 years whether they are sexually active or not.
⁹ Due 10 years after the 4-6 year of age vaccination
