

Learning For Living Courses

The Learning For Living courses are non-credit courses. The course expectations, in an alternative course, are individualized for the student and generally focus on preparing the student for daily living. The alternative expectations are developed to help students acquire knowledge and skills that are not represented in the Ontario curriculum. Because they are not part of a subject or course outlined in the provincial curriculum documents, alternative expectations are considered to constitute alternative programs. Students, in this program, will receive an alternate report card which differs from the provincial report card. Course expectations will be based on the student's Individual Education Plan.

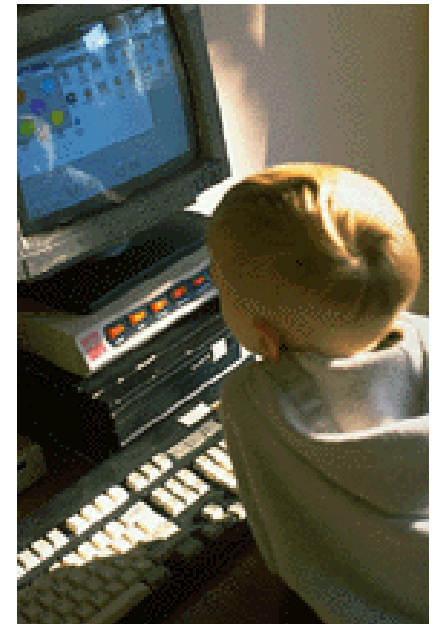

promotes programs where inclusion is balanced with courses that prepare intellectually challenged students to lead productive, active lives in post-secondary years. These students can remain in secondary school until the age of 21, if they or their parents/guardians wish.

With support at annual I.P.R.C. meetings, parents are encouraged to become involved with outside agencies such as the *Association for Community Living*, or the *Ontario Disability Support Program* to help their child prepare for their next transition after secondary school.

Learning For Living courses are designed to help students become more aware of the world around them. The program focuses on literacy, numeracy, and life skills.
